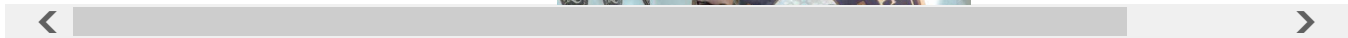


BREW AT THE 2017 RI CONVENTION IN ATLANTA

BREW MAKES FIRST DONATION TO WASRAG AS START OF COLLABORATION

The collaboration between BREW and WASRAG (Water and Sanitation Rotary Action Group) moved forward with a \$2500 donation from BREW to WASRAG at our Annual General meeting at the RI Convention in Atlanta.

This donation is the first of future donations that implements our decision to donate 25% of our annual membership revenue to WASRAG every year at the RI Convention.



Ron Denham, head of WASRAG, accepted a \$2,500 check from BREW Board of Directors at our General business meeting at the Atlanta Convention



BREW is beginning work to create a campaign to solicit donations from large and small around the world to recognize the commendable efforts of Stella Artois supporting clean water projects.

WASRAG has agreed to create specific geographic accounts in their WASRAG Foundation so that

Regal Pale Ale

It's never too hot for hops! Maybe your favorite imperial hop-bomb isn't the best beach sipper (don't let me tell you!), but hops are a great thirst quencher that balance out malt sweetness that might otherwise be too much under the summer sun.

This National Homebrew Competition gold-medal American pale ale recipe pairs up a hefty hop schedule with 2-row, crystal and wheat malts, making for a deliciously refreshing homebrew with a nice balance of sweet and bitter. Dry hopping 2 ounces of hops in secondary adds aromatic kick to compliment the 28 IBUs.

INGREDIENTS

For 5 gallons (18.93 L)

8.5 lb (3.9 kg) | Pale 2-Row malt

10.0 oz (283 g) | 20° L Crystal malt

5.0 oz (142 g) | 80° L Crystal malt

5.0 oz (142 g) | CaraVienne malt

7.0 oz (142 g) | Wheat malt

0.4 oz (11 g) | Nugget pellet hops, 13% a.a. (60 min)

1.0 oz (28 g) | Cascade pellet hops, 5.5% a.a. (5 min)

0.4 oz (11 g) | Nelson Sauvin pellet hops, 12.5% a.a. (5 min)

1.0 oz (28 g) | Cascade pellet hops, 5.5% a.a. (dry)

1.0 oz (28 g) | Nelson Sauvin pellet hops, 12.5% a.a. (dry)

White Labs WLP001 California Ale, Wyeast 1056 American Ale, Safale US-05 Ale, or Danstar BRY-9



SPECIFICATIONS

Original Gravity: 1.056 (14° P)

Final Gravity: 1.014 (3° P)

ABV: 5.5%

IBU: 26



SRM: 8°

Boil Time: 60 minutes

Efficiency: 75%

Pre-boil Volume: n/a

Pre-boil Gravity: n/a

DIRECTIONS

Mash grains at 154°F (68°C) for 60 minutes.

Batch sparge at 168°F (76°C).

Bring to a rolling boil for 60 minutes, add hops at specified intervals from end of boil.

Chill wort to 67°F (19°C) and pitch yeast.

After nine days, rack to secondary fermenter and dry hop.

Let rest another nine days at 68°F (20°C).

Keg at 2.5 volumes of CO₂ or bottle condition with 4 oz (113 g) corn sugar.

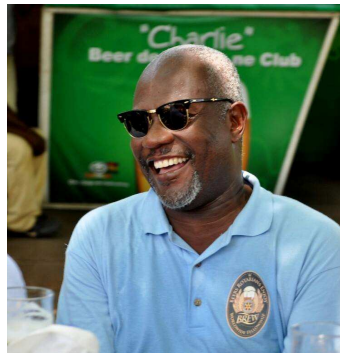

He has tasted beer from 4 of the 6 Continents in the W is currently in Accra, Ghana and will hopefully be in To for the 2018 Rotary's International Convention.

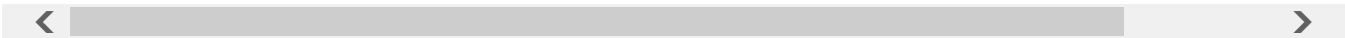

BREW'S GUIDE TO HOLDING A BEERFEST

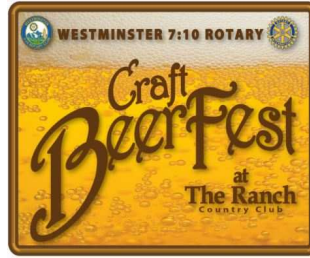
Given that the most frequent question we get from our members relates to how to put on a beerfest, we believe one of the most beneficial services we can provide is a guide on how to hold a beerfest.

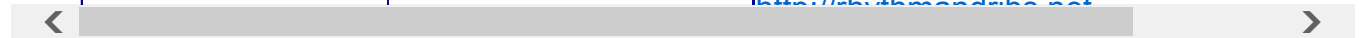
